RECYCLABLE MATTER (blue bin)

Containers, packaging, printed matter

Containers and packaging (examples):

-  Household cleaning product containers
-  Packaging, jar and container of food products
-  Cardboard box
-  Aluminum foil and plate
-  Packaging of takeaway and prepared food



Good moves:

-  Empty and lightly rinse out containers
-  Remove lids from jars and containers except for small caps
-  Crush aluminum sheets into compact balls, even when lightly used, before placing them in the bin
-  Undo and fold your cardboard boxes

Printed paper (examples):

-  Newspapers and flyers
-  Envelopes
-  Lined or squared paper sheets
-  Notebooks



What doesn't go in the bin?

-  Batteries
-  Syringes
-  Garden hoses
-  Plastic chairs
-  Toys
-  Cookware
-  Textiles



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COMPOSTABLE MATTER (brown bin)

FOOD RESIDU

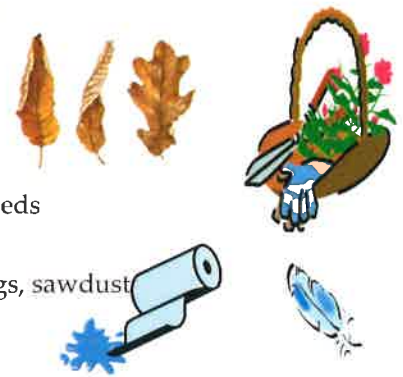
-  Fruits & vegetables
-  Coffee (grinds & filters) and tea bags
-  Bread, cereals, pasta
-  Meat, poultry (residue and bones)
-  Fish and seafood
-  Dairy products (cheese, butter, etc.)
-  Egg shells
-  Table scraps and foods past their prime



-  Domestic animal litter
-  Cold ashes

GREEN RESIDUE

-  Grass
-  Dead leaves
-  Sod
-  Garden soil
-  Flowers, plants, weeds
-  Gardening residue
-  Bark, wood shavings, sawdust
-  Roots



OTHER

-  Papers soiled with food (paper towels, napkins, etc.)
-  Feathers and hair

RESIDUAL GARBAGE (green, gray or black bin)

Matter which cannot be composted or recycled

-  Styrofoam (cups, plates)
-  Garden hoses
-  Cigarette butts
-  Diapers
-  Hygienic pads and tampons



-  Soiled tissues
-  Tarps, swimming pool covers
-  Dishes and drinking glasses
-  Mirrors
-  Ceramics
